Cultivating Pluricultural Citizens of **Character** and **Courage**

Our pedagogical approach places a strong emphasis on multidisciplinary bilingualism from Kindergarten onwards. Year after year, our students develop both their socio-emotional skills as well as their intellectual curiosity.

LFT Students deepen their knowledge in academic subjects through instruction and numerous cultural projects. They challenge themselves through the

discipline of 2 series of national exams in their pursuit of hard-earned academic diplomas (DNB in Grade 9 and the *Baccalauréat* in Grade 12). The academic, linguistic and interpersonal skills, acquired through a curriculum of excellence in a pluricultural context, provide our students with the confidence to pursue their studies all over the world.

Languages

From Kindergarten, all core subjects are taught by native French teachers. A rigorous English course is also being held daily by native English teachers. As a result, our students become bilingual.

Students begin studying Spanish in Grade 7. Language learning at LFT is based on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) and the students may take language certification exams based on their level (DELF, Cambridge, DELE).

School Life Engagement

In High School, the schedule at Lycée français de Toronto runs from 8:30 am to 5:45 pm, representing up to 40 hours of instructional time, and the corresponding homework.

Nevertheless, students are given the opportunity to take an active role in the life of their community by becoming class representatives, being elected onto the School Council (CVL), and by participating in clubs: Maths club, Media club, Astronomy club, Yearbook committee, Model UN, etc.

Grades 9 & 10

Grade 9 (*troisième*) is the final year of middle school (*collège*) which formally concludes with *Le Diplôme National du Brevet des Collèges* (DNB). The DNB is awarded following a series of culminating national examinations that students take.

Students in Grades 9 and 10 take a common core of courses and have the option to further extend their studies to include additional courses (language, Latin, cinema studies). Students also have the option to further enhance their courses taught in English by selecting the American International Section.

Grade 10 (*seconde*) is the transitional year that precedes the *Baccalauréat*. Students develop their autonomy and explore their interests before choosing their specializations (*Enseignement de Spécialités*).

The *Baccalauréat*: Grades 11 & 12

Grades 11 (*Première*) and 12 (*Terminale*) are the final years of the French curriculum, together they determine the *Baccalauréat* final Grade. Mandatory courses include common core subjects as well as the specialties chosen by the student (three specialties in Grade 11, reduced to two in Grade 12) that will provide rigorous discipline-specific preparation for university level studies.

Students continue to have the option to take on additional electives to supplement their learning experience. The American International Section is also an elective open to all students interested in deepening their understanding of Literature, History and Geography.

On average, over 95% of LFT students earn "Mention" on their final *Baccalauréat* results, with almost half of students receiving the highest honor "mention Très Bien".

Grading

Academic achievement in the French system is graded on a 0 to 20 points scale.

Students are assessed according to the skills needed to demonstrate proficiency in their specific disciplines. Written examinations may call for essay responses and problem solving and rarely rely on multiple choice answers.

The academic year is divided into three terms. A Grade is assigned at the end of each term and the average Grade across all three terms determines the overall achievement for that year. The Lycée Français de Toronto neither calculates nor publishes class rankings.

Academic Qualifications for Post-Secondary Studies

The *Baccalauréat* is the diploma that LFT students earn after completing a secondary school education and it serves as the students' academic qualification for post-secondary studies. A student's achievement on the *Baccalauréat* is determined by a mix of national final examinations, exams given by teachers locally over the course of Grades 11 and 12, and students' annual averages. Final exams, both written and oral, are evaluated by official examiners. One of the hallmarks of the *Baccalauréat* is *Le Grand Oral*, a prepared defense of a research project related to one or both of their Grade 12 specialty courses.

Many universities across the world recognize the *Baccalauréat* as an advanced secondary school curriculum. Students applying with *Baccalauréat* credentials secure admissions to even the most selective universities and university programs and many universities grant students up to a full year of credit or advanced standing.

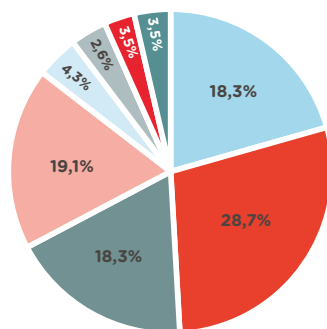

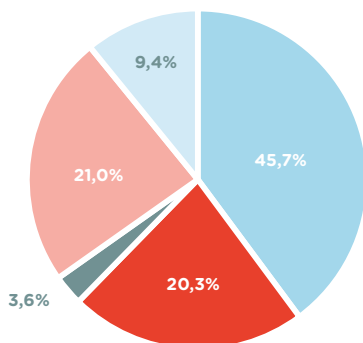
